Dear Sir

I am a resident of Beaver Dam, Arizona, in the most north western corner of Arizona, sort of a forgotten part of Arizona- -until the state of Nevada realized Beaver Dam sits on a most desirable aquifer of pure sweet untainted water. Now Mesquite Nevada wants to take our water to upgrade their arsenic-laden water and sell to Las Vegas what they don't need.

In other words, they want the state of Arizona to GIVE to the state of Nevada approximately 4 billion gallons per year. Beaver Dam residents would not be reimbursed for their loss of water or the value of their property that would suffer subsidence and become worthless.

Wind River Resources filed the application to transport Arizona water across the state line to Nevada will receive \$4 million to \$6 million per year for 50 years. Virgin Valley Water District in Mesquite, Nevada is not stating how much they will profit from stealing the water from the Beaver Dam residents.

There are approximately 2000 electrical hook-ups in the Beaver Dam-Littlefield-Desert Springs area. The schools in Beaver Dam are from Kindergarden through the 12th grades. There is a new fire station in Beaver Dam, a Medical and Dental Clinic in Desert Springs, a new Three Million dollar Church in Littlefield. Trailer Parks are over-flowing with visitors from the frozen north.

I sincerely pray that you will see the greed and uncaring attitude of Nevada water interests and rule against the Wind River Resources application to transfer water across the Arizona state border to Nevada.
